

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2018-19

In this Annual Report you will see comprehensive details of the Tea Gardens Hawks Nest Surf Life Saving Club year. My report aims to highlight some of our achievements and acknowledge those that helped achieve our year.

LIFESAVING

Our Club met its patrol commitments. It has been difficult meeting those obligations as a lot of members have been away on many occasions. This is reflected in that only 35 out of 87 members gained their 100% patrol attendance awards. Thanks to all those who filled in when we were very short, especially over Christmas and Easter and also when the Boaties were competing.

Thanks to our Club Captain, Jan, the Patrol Captains and all our patrolling members for their commitment to Surf Life Saving.

The highlight of the year for me was when Millie Ross, Matt Love, Cody Ross and Sam Hyde looked after Tyler Love when he seriously injured his neck and when on Sharkies patrol the senior members were away and the junior members completely ran the patrol. All but one of these young lifesavers have come through the nippers of our Club. These young people have done themselves proud and are a credit to themselves, their parents and to the club.

It was also pleasing to see the support the patrol members gave our competitors by ensuring we met our voluntary obligations when they were away representing the club in competition. If we do not patrol the beach there are NO Nippers, NO Competition, NO Social and **NO SURF CLUB.**

EDUCATION

Thanks to our training officers Megan and Fitz, and with the assistance of Debbie, our members gained 39 awards. Megan, Fitz, Debbie and Kelly also ensured that our patrolling members were trained with all Surf Life Saving operating updates and proficiencies. Megan and Fitz worked tirelessly in their first year in this position and did an outstanding job. Along with conducting First Aid courses for our members and local community, Deb also ran three Surf Education classes during the Christmas Holidays at the Hawks Nest Caravan Park and John, Ian and myself travelled to the Dungog Show on 'School Day' to promote Surf Life Saving.

COMPETITION

Our small number of competitors performed exceptionally. Our reserve men's boat crew won their event at the World Surf Life Saving Championships in Adelaide and our members also gained places in the Australian, State and Branch Championships. Sophie Howarth was a member of the Branch Team which came third in the Inter Competition.

All the boat crews gained places in the Street's series. The standout competitor was Jan who won 3 Australian, 3 State and 2 Branch medals. Thanks to Greg for running the boat crews, to Liza for taking care of the entries and both for organizing crews at the Boat Carnival.

NIPPERS

As always, the nippers are the life blood of our club. They had an exceptional year thanks to Brad and Logan. They continued their education in Surf Life Saving gaining their Surf Awareness Awards and participating in the varying and challenging Sunday Morning Competition that was organized by Brad and Logan.

Besides the almost overwhelming administrative demands that are required for the Nipper's proficiencies and Surf Smart, Safe Play and Surf Awareness awards, they have just got on with the job and made it happen. They have been absolutely fantastic. Nine nippers competed in the Branch and State Championships. At Branch they won 9 medals.

ADMINISTRATION

Max & John have been outstanding. The demands on volunteer administrators in Surf Life Saving can be many and onerous. For the Surf Club to be successful in meeting Regulatory and Surf Life Saving requirements these demands must be met. Both Max & John have been tremendous. Without the work they do the Club could hardly operate.

Max takes care of all the correspondence, ensures that we are compliant with SLSA requirements and liaises with all the demands that are put on us. AND THAT IS CONSIDERABLE! Thanks to her we have been successful with several Grant applications over many years allowing us in part to move forward with out Club refurbishment.

John ensures that the equipment is 100%, the IRB's are opperational, the trailers are registered and the boards have no holes in them, the boats and oars work, there is always fuel, the toilets work etc pays the bills, deposits the money, keeps the books and does all the regulatory requirements for the bar, is a force behind the building renovations and when there is any work to be done he is always there contributing.

Thank you, Kate, for ensuring that all members are registered and compliant regarding the Working with Children regulations. It is a very time consuming, thankless and demanding role but it proved to be vital when one of our members suffered an injury during the season. Compliance with member registration requirements ensures each member is insured. In addition to this role, she has also taken care of the upkeep of the web and face book pages and stood in as President when I was away in May/June. Debbie Booth prepared our Safe Children Guidelines which are now on the web site. Thanks Deb.

BUILDING

After many meetings, discussions and consultation, building renovations have commenced. The old look-out and railing on the sea side balconcy have been replaced with a glass balustrade and the interior is now under renovation. The first stage involves upstairs work of relocating the Kitchen and Bar to the North West corner, replacing the stairs, installing a disable toilet, opening the east face and half of the south wall with glass doors and panels. Downstairs the east face will be opened with glass doors, the entire floor made level and the west entrance will be renovated. In addition, an area will be set-up for the gym. A mightly thanks to the building committee members John, Michael, Brian, Greg, Liza, Steve & Catriona. Michael has been the standout. His contribution has been tremendous.

Through the support of David Gillespie, we have been promised a \$300,000 Grant for the ground floor renovations from the Commonwealth Government. It is proposed, pending member approval, that the work will be extended downstairs to include renovation of the toilets, installing a disabled toilet, complete fit out of common area, complete fit out of gym, revamp of club exterior, tiling the floor or similar and also tiling or similar of the upstairs balcony. There will also be work done on the exterior of the building.

BUILDING REFURBISHMENT REPORT

I am pleased to present the Building Sub Committee report for 2019.

This was the year building redevelopment work commenced on the TGHN SLSC Club house.

First up was the balustrading on the front balcony. A builder was sought, balustrade designed, the old BBQ room and balustrade demolished, and new balustrade erected.

This was a learning curve for all involved. The Surf Club is a commercial building, requiring engineering drawings of the balustrade before the construction could start. This led to difficulty in finding a business that was prepared to construct the balustrade. Eventually a design was agreed upon, engineering approved, a builder engaged, and the balcony built. It looks fantastic.

The balcony was completed due to the determination and perseverance of Tony Logue and the design and build experience of Michael Rose. We thank them both.

Stage Two: The redevelopment of the Surf Club building. A great deal of time was spent in consultation with club members for the design of the redevelopment, a plan was drawn, and the Development Application submitted.

The DA took some months to be approved. In that time a builder was engaged to commence demolition works. The interior of the clubhouse has been stripped out in readiness for the rebuilding. The DA was eventually approved, and the next step undertaken, the gaining of a Construction Certificate. At the time of writing the Construction Certificate is still a work in progress. The Club has engaged a Certifier to certify the build, hired consultants to provide needed reports and consulted with Mid Coast Council about their requirements for the building.

Hopefully the Construction Certificate will be in hand and the building works commenced by the 2019 AGM.

I would like to thank all members of the TGHNSLSC committee, the Building Sub-Committee and Surf Club members for their guidance, support, ideas and goodwill.

I would especially like to thank our President, Tony, and Acting President, Kate-Louise Maddison for their leadership of the redevelopment and Brian Watson for guiding the program through the Development application and Construction Certificate and Michael Rose for the skills, expertise, and drive he brings to the redevelopment.

lan's careful stewardship and management of the Surf Club's finances has allowed the Club to maintain its assets in very good order as well as cover any contingencies that may have arisen. Thank you lan.

A big thank you also to the Tea Gardens Hawks Nest SLSC Secretary, Maxine Cook. Maxine has a gift for obtaining grant funds for the TGHNSLSC. These funds allow for the addition to and upgrade of the Club's equipment. Thank you Max. A large grant obtained several years ago, with past President, Stephen Howell (being held by SLSNSW) has been instrumental in progressing the redevelopment of the Club house.

Much of our financial reserves accumulated by lan, along with current and future grants will be going towards the Surf Club redevelopment. The reality of spending Surf Club funds on the building is that the value of the Club's assets, investments, are expensed and the value of the Council Community Asset, Club house is increased. This can be justified as it is the Community support over many years that have enabled the Clubs investments to grow. The TGHNSLSC relies heavily on Community support. Over the course of the year, TGHNSLSC received \$32,200 in donations. The Club appreciates the continuing goodwill of the Tea Gardens Hawks Nest community. Without its support, we could not continue to provide life saving services on the beach.

During the past year the Club's Auditor, Ken Guy, passed away. Ken provided a great service to the Club during his time as the Auditor. He advice and assistance was always appreciated by the former Treasurer and myself. We offer our condolences to his family and friends.

Judy Brown of Browns Audit and Assurances Services has been engaged as the new Club auditor.

A look at some items on the Club's accounts:

Membership revenue - \$11,205 of which the Club retained \$3556, about 30%. The difference went on membership services, SLSNSW, SLSA, Hunter Branch, Insurance etc.

Bar revenue - \$30,422 - Jill is outstanding as our Licensee and to her and all her helpers, thank you. **Calcutta** - \$1567 – always a good night. Thank you all who assisted and those members that supported with fund-raiser.

Club House Hire - \$4,718– Thank you Linda for your efforts in coordinating our hires and Jan & Tony for the weekly (*or more frequent if required*) cleaning. **Motorfest** - \$588

The Club met all its obligations with the beach patrolled on all weekends and public holidays. I am pleased to report no lives were lost.

Thank you everyone on the patrol roster for all the hours you were able to attend. It was good to see the boaties committing to the same hours. My sincere thanks to everyone who gained the attendance award for your dedication and commitment.

My thanks to the patrol captains who led their patrols into efficient confident teams a great job that was really well done. I attended the beach 109 times during the season when we were patrolling to check on patrol morale, attendance and their requirements.

All patrols maintained a high level of surveillance resulting in fewer rescues overall but a high number of preventative actions. However on the second last week of the season we had a large number of rescues. On Sharkies patrol there was a mass rescue when a flash rip took many people beyond the break. Four people got in difficulties and needed to be rescued with the IRB and girls with tubes. The next morning Squirtles patrol led by Brad Love rescued eleven people and dealt with a 'walk-out' spinal that was hospitalised. Also that morning during their IRB assessment, Rex Shelton and Dan Rodgers rescued a man in demanding surf conditions.

We had seven patrols rostered for between 59.5 and 64 hours each. This is a very big ask which showed at times when members were unable to attend. On one occasion no one was available so my most grateful thanks to Megan, Debbie, Sharon and Tony for helping me out at short notice. We had a great attendance on Christmas Day resulting in the beach being well patrolled throughout the day. Also thank you to all for helping out at the boat carnival making it a great success. Your suport and commitment was very much appreciated.

Congratulations to Megan and Fitzy in their first season as trainers – you both did a great job. To everyone who gained awards well done.

Thank you to everyone who assisted in making my job easier. Also a special acknowledgement to Maxine, Debbie & Tony for their assistance and to John who looked after all the gear and made sure that the IRB's and motors were looked after and seaworthy.

GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT 2018-19

I am pleased to present the Gear Steward's report for the 18– 19 season.

The Club's contractual relationship with Kentan Machinery, of Hexham, again provided a new Kubota at the start of the new surf season. An equipment Grant (Beach Safe) from SLSA covered the changeover cost resulting in a new machine on the beach with little cost to the Club. The arrangement continues to be of a great benefit to the Club, ensuring high reliability and virtually no maintenance issues during the Surf Life Saving season.

The new Mercury outboard motor ordered last season has been delivered. Two of the Club's oldest motors have been sold, leaving the Club with three very good order motors.

The Club has sold two old IRB's and ordered and paid a deposit on a new Archilles as replacement. There have been some compliance issues with the new IRB which has now been settled and the IRB will be delivered early in the new financial year. The Club will have three good order IRB's.

Six old competition boards have been written off to provide space for the increased number of nipper and rescue boards acquired over the last few years. These boards have been on the rack for many years with very little use.

A donation from LJ Chester, coupled with a successful Grant, enabled a new sweep oar to be purchased. Thank you LJ.

A new Oxy-Viva was presented to the Club at the Hunter Branch Awards of Excellence. The club now has six oxygen units on hand.

Arrangements have been made with Vital Resus to do the required annual servicing of the Club's oxygen equipment and defibs on site. This will ensure all first aid equipment remains available should it be needed. Vital Resus combine the service with others in town to reduce the travelling cost to the Club. Maintenance, structural and running repairs were carried out on the surf boats, rescue and nipper boards, ATV, equipment and buildings when required.

I would like to thank all members of the Surf Club for their ongoing help and support throughout the year.

FIRST AID OFFICER'S REPORT 2018-19

TGHNSLSC first-aid equipment and expertise have served our rostered beach patrols as well as other beach related community activities including nippers training, boat carnivals, the Myall Masters open water swim and a medivac from Yacaaba headland.

First aiders have treated a range of presentations from minor cuts and abrasions and many blue bottle stings to shoulder and arm injuries, possible and actual spinal injuries, head injury and medical issues including asthma, hypoglycaemia and shock.

We have continued to improve our equipment and quality processes. This season in alignment with new surf lifesaving protocols we have introduced haemostatic gauze for bleeding control in traumatic injury and prepared related education materials. Covers for ice packs were introduced to prevent tissue injury when using cold / heat therapy. Skin wash and antiseptics in kits were changed for those with less potential to cause skin irritation or allergy.

For next season, an additional resus kit awarded at the Hunter Surf Lifesaving Awards of Excellence will further streamline our potential responsiveness by combining O² therapy and defibrillator in the one waterproof kit.

Working with our gear steward, our first aid compliance and maintenance will occur on site to rationalize the process and remove the necessity to take gear off site prior to our next season's commencement.

A log of our first aid kits and equipment has been developed to ensure all our gear is routinely checked.


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FAREWELL - CHRIS 'TURTLE' SANDO

He was an attendee at the SLSA National Leadership college and received a High Distinction as TGHNSLSC's nomination at the HSLS Awards of Excellence for 'Lifesaver of the Year' in June 2018. He completed all education awards possible and received numerous club accolades and awards during his time with us.

We will all miss this very much respected, capable club member and wish him nothing but the best for the future.



FAREWELL – JAN & TONY LOGUE

How do we ever begin to write a farewell note of gratitude and admiration about "The Logues" (or Logies as they are affectionally called) - two phenomenal, highly respected and esteemed club members. Mere words are inadequate to describe what they have both given toTGHNSLSC, Hunter Branch, Surf Lifesaving Australia and our local community as a whole.

They have always continued to be strong advocates for our core business of lifesaving, and have stated numerous times, that Patrols are the essence of Surf Lifesaving, which is very evident by their recorded patrolling history. Whilst their patrolling hours, over a 35-year span, are only a very small component of their contributions for the betterment of TGHNSLSC, they have held many positions at our club including President, Club Captain, Treasurer, Secretary and Chief Training Officer. Tony has been a Duty Officer for HSLS and Jan District Supervisor for several years. During the past season they fulfilled the roles of Club Captain (Jan) and President (Tony) - leadership positions carried out with utmost selflessness and inclusiveness. They have been involved in countless rescues, too many first aid treatments to mention, as well as educating and assessing hundreds of club members in all SLS awards (both holding their SLSA 20 Years Assessing Certificate) at both a club and branch level. Together and individually, they display exemplary commitment to Surf Lifesaving and through their enduring service both these members have demonstrated a work ethic of the highest order. Exceptional surf life savers who are held in the highest esteem by the lifesaving fraternity.

Included in TGHNSLSC history *The Vigilant Hawk* by Ian Dunlop (at p.139) is a note of a NOTA NEWSPAPER ARTICLE dated 21/8/93 and headed 'Life memberships awarded to club stalwarts' which reported, '...*Tony & Jan Logue have put in many selfless hours over the past years, always with the interest and future of the club at heart, showing outstanding service both to TGHNSLSC and to surf lifesaving in general*'. This commitment by them has not only continued but has strengthened since that article's publication. Jan and Tony Logue are nothing short of exceptional – both holding a 30 Years SLSA Long Service Award and 35 Years National Patrol Service Award – meaning for the past 35 years they have attained 100% attendance with vigilance and service. During the span of their careers Tony has gained 115 awards and Jan 96 awards.

Both have represented Tea Gardens Hawks Nest SLSC & SLSNSW/SLSA in the competition arena (beach & water events) at Branch, State, National and International SLS Carnivals for many years bringing home a swag of medals. In the Companion Edition of the Northern Surf Lifesaver (p.58), Chris Conrick describes Tony Logue as 'club stalwart, a virtual one-man carnival who competes in just about anything going'. Tony was awarded Branch Master Competitor at the 2014/15 Awards of Excellence. Counted in his accomplishments in the competition arena is GOLD at the Australian Titles in March 2016 and World Champion 2km beach run at the World Masters Surf Lifesaving Championships in Auckland, New Zealand in 1998 and Bronze in the 1km beach sprint in Noordwijk in 2017. Not to be outdone, Jan also achieved World Champion titles in both the Flags and Beach Sprint at the same championships in New Zealand and Silver in the 1km Beach Run & Flags at Noordwijk in 2017. She was awarded HSLS Female Master Competitor of the Year in June, 2015, 2017 and again 18-19 after winning Gold at Australian, State and Branch events. Tony was World Champion for the 2km beach run at the World Masters Championships – Rescue 2000 in 1999/2000. Both were awarded Gold as team members for TGHNSLSC which won first place in the first statewide NSW Surf Patrol Competition (February 1990) & also first place in the State IRB Titles (June 1994). They were team members for TGHNSLSC when it won the State Surf Rescue Challenge (February 1991). Their competition spans beach, surf and IRB events and extend over many seasons. Jan and Tony Logue have continually demonstrated prowess as outstanding athletes and those recorded above are only a very small snapshot of this pairs outstanding achievements. Each actively competed in Masters Competition again this season, acknowledging that competition maintains fitness and hones surf skills to the benefit of beach patrols. Over the years they have shared their competition knowledge and skills with our young Nippers and other budding competitors before carnivals to assist in building their knowledge and skills. Their presence and sound common-sense approach will be very much missed.

During their prestigious SLS careers both Jan and Tony have been awarded HSLS 'Lifesaver of the Year' accolades and are also Life Members of TGHNSLSC and HSLS.

Jan and Tony will be irreplaceable in our club. Their enduring commitment, passion and love of their voluntary roles is praiseworthy and exemplary. We wish them both nothing but the very best in their retirement.
